This means that Agriculture Technician graduates can build on their education and earn an associate degree with one more year of college.

The Agriculture Technician program is offered at both the Lakeshore Technical College (LTC) and Moraine Park campus via in-person classes at LTC and live interactive television classes at MPTC. *General studies classes and labs can be taken at Moraine Park.
