Financial Aid

Financial Aid is available for associate degree and technical diploma programs (those that are 2 semesters in length and typically with 28 credits or more). Processing can take 4-5 weeks after a student's completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA (<https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa/>)) is received. While attending Moraine Park during the 2024-25 school year, your estimated cost of attendance for one full year includes tuition of \$4,462 (15 credits for fall and spring semester), fees of \$338, food and housing of \$3,008 (if living with parents, \$9,147 if living on your own), books and supplies of \$1,465, personal expenses of \$3,608, and transportation of \$4,017 for a total of \$17,002. Your direct costs (those costs paid directly to the college) include tuition & fees. The indirect costs (costs not paid to the college) can vary from individual to individual and your own personal needs.
